HELLO WISCONSIN 4-H'ERS!


Welcome to a new year in Wisconsin 4-H. We are so excited to have you as part of this growing, thriving, and passionate community!

SHOOTING SPORTS

4-H Shooting Sports is a national program involving 4-H youth and adult 4-H volunteers. The Wisconsin 4-H program uses the National 4-H Shooting Sports curriculum to teach shooting sports safety to more than **5,000** youth with over **400** adult volunteer instructors across the state.

The Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports program in your area is geared for teaching beginning target shooting skills for youth at junior, intermediate and senior levels. Beginners learn basic skills through the county 4-H Shooting Sports program, advance to fun shoots within the county, progress to statewide invitational events and have the opportunity to make the Wisconsin National 4-H Shooting Sports Team competing at the National 4-H Championships at Grand Island, Nebraska.

Teams that compete at State Livestock Judging previously qualified at the district Area Animal Science Days throughout the state.

MEATS JUDGING

GRADES 3-12

DATES TO BE ANNOUNCED

UW-MADISON MEAT SCIENCE AND ANIMAL BIOLOGICS DISCOVERY BUILDING

This contest tests the knowledge of youth in the placement of carcass and retail cut classes, carcass grading, retail cut identification, and a quiz. This contest occurs annually with the top teams traveling to Kansas City, MO and Denver, CO for national competition.



4-H LIVESTOCK QUIZ BOWL & SKILLATHON

GRADES 3RD - 12TH

FEBRUARY 2023

LOCATION TO BE ANNOUNCED

Livestock Quiz Bowl is a quiz competition with questions about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Students use a buzzer in order to answer the questions orally from a moderator.

The Skillathon contest includes a written quiz and learning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification, and team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. The top senior level 4-H team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Skillathon Contest, held each fall in Louisville, KY.



AG SUMMIT

The National 4-H Youth Summit for Agri-Science brings together teen agriculture and science leaders from across the country to focus on learning about and solving current agri-science issues. Students work with each other and experts in the agricultural community to develop a community change project to initiate in their state. Members are nominated for this experience locally by staff and then selected to attend through a state level process.

GRADES 3-12 LATE WINTER 2023

This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness, self-confidence, teamwork skills, and mastery in the area of dairy science.

Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator.

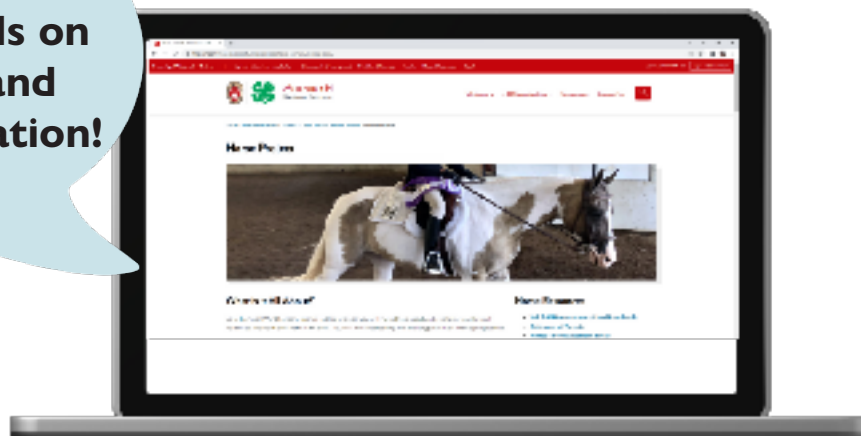

4-H Art Beat is the introductory program for Wisconsin 4-H Communication Arts and was created for 4-H members in grades 3-5, their parents, and leaders. Art Beat provides an opportunity for youth and their parents to experience five different art forms in a camping environment at Camp Upham Woods in Wisconsin Dells.

The weekend features a look at a variety of arts projects including music, drama, visual arts, art in nature, and more! Both youth and adult participants stay in the cabins on Cabin Hill. Parents are not required to attend, but are invited.

STATE ARTS TEAMS

4-H DRAMA COMPANY

creates a stage performance involving acting, song and dance in the five days leading up to 4-H and Youth Conference. Show content is a collaborative effort between company members and their director. Each Drama Company member contributes ideas for the show and works with the group to problem solve issues on the set and in the script. Drama Company takes their show on to the Wisconsin State Fair where they perform for fair goers from across the state.



4-H ART TEAM

creates artwork around the theme of the Wisconsin 4-H and Youth Conference as well as designing and organizing the WI 4-H and Youth Conference art exhibit, reception and guided exhibit tours. The team members also teach seminars and train to be peer leaders for county and regional events including the Wisconsin State Fair. The 4-H Art Team is led by a professional artist who teaches team members artistic techniques using a variety of mediums.

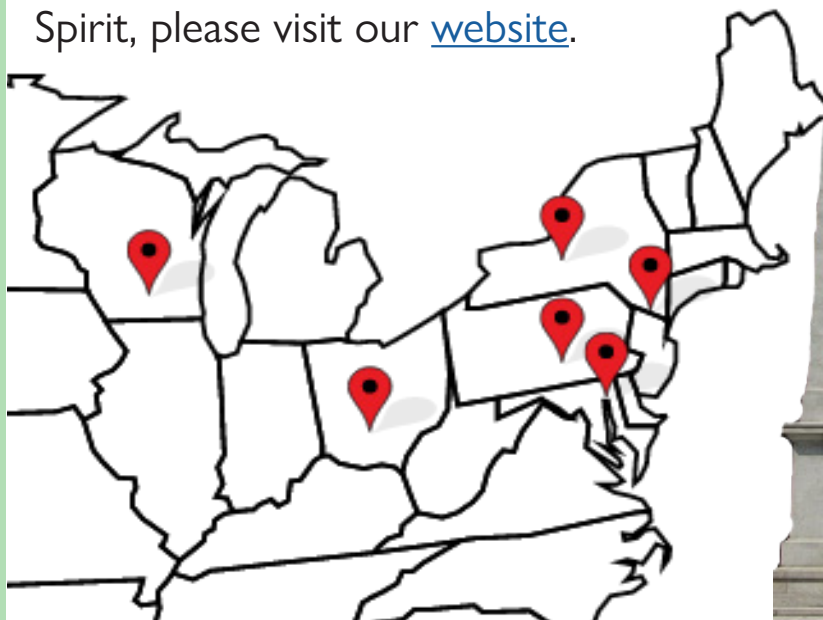

INBOUND PROGRAMS

Each summer Wisconsin families have the opportunity to host a youth from

Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Mexico or Costa Rica

for one month. Families learn about another culture while sharing their own lives through meals, events, holidays, games, chores and more. No special plans are needed as these youth want to experience American culture, make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family. Expand your horizons, learn about another culture, and develop lifelong friendships without even leaving your home!

GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP PROGRAMMING

To bring the experience of other cultures and create the opportunity for 4-H youth in Wisconsin to connect with other youth from across the world, WI 4-H International offers several virtual options for connecting participants internationally!

Pen Pal Program

Typically offered in the Spring, the Pen Pal Program connects Wisconsin youth to youth from around the world. The Spring 2022 Pen Pal Program partnered with “Tabur Kencana Nusantara,” a youth organization formed by a previous 4-H academic year exchange student who stayed in Wisconsin. Participants were between the ages of 14 and 18 and were matched based on self-identified interests.

Global Exploration Series

WI 4-H International Programs partnered with International Reach (Reach), a cross-cultural speakers program sponsored by UW-Madison International Student Services. Through a series of bi-weekly virtual connections, WI 4-H youth and families have the opportunity to connect and learn from UW-Madison international students serving as Ambassadors from a variety of countries. OUTBOUND PROGRAMS

Every summer, 4-H youth travel abroad for the amazing opportunity to experience life in another country by living with a host family for one or two months. All programs are chaperoned by a trained 4-H adult volunteer, who remains in-country with the delegation during the exchange for support and assistance. While abroad, 4-H'ers learn about their host country's culture while sharing their own. At the end of the month, delegates return home with friendships and memories to last a lifetime! Applications for Summer Outbound Programs are due in late November/early December.

Benefits of the Exchange

- Learn about another culture and way of living first-hand by experiencing daily life as a member of a family in a different country
- Better understand yourself and your own culture
- Become more informed on global issues
- Increase self-esteem and confidence by learning to adapt to new situations and ways of communication
- Foster positive cross-cultural attitudes that enhance mutual

AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIPS



Key Awards

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program is one of the highest recognitions a 4-H member can receive. This award recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. To be eligible, candidates for this award must be at least in 9th grade or older, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

Crowley Dairy Leadership Award

The 4-H Dairy Leadership Award provides recognition to youth who have excelled in their dairy project. Eligibility for this award includes: Must be currently enrolled in the 4-H Dairy Project and have at least two previous years of membership, must be in 10th-13th grades as of January 1, and should have an outstanding record of involvement and accomplishments in the 4-H Dairy Project.

Fifteen (15) state-level awards are to be presented annually to outstanding 4-H Dairy Project members. Award plaques will be given to the top fifteen and the top three youth will each receive \$1000 cash awards. Youth that have received a plaque only are encouraged to apply again. Additionally, the top 4-H member that is a Junior in high school as of January 1, 2022 will be offered a \$5000 scholarship to attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison and enroll in the Department of Dairy and Animal Sciences.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarship

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation awarded scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2022. Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance, and future educational goals. Applicants who are awarded scholarships were notified by postal letter and email in May.
